The Great Lakes Region includes the states and Canadian provinces that drain into the Great Lakes. For this bibliography, The Great Lakes – Superior, Michigan, Huron, Erie, and Ontario comprise a large area of freshwater unrivaled by anywhere else. The Odonata fauna has been studied in the region for over 150 years, and the body of literature is substantial enough to warrant its own bibliography. I purposely left out papers that dealt specifically with faunas not influenced by the Great Lakes, such as SE Pennsylvania and SE New York. It is as complete as I can make it, and if you see significant omissions, please contact me.
